## *From the Pastor*

Our family has begun the tedious process of packing. It’s a daunting task that can be physically and emotionally draining. While sorting and packing boxes my mind begins to wander to what will happen after the boxes are unpacked. What will my life look like as I begin a new position as Superintendent of the Wilkes-Barre District in July? What next?

What next? I’m sure that was what all the disciples wondered when they first heard of the resurrection. The disciples weren’t fully prepared for what would happen after Good Friday. It was a shock to lose their rabbi that they had followed for three years. . . and the way that they lost him – to the horrible death of Roman crucifixion. Then, that Sunday morning the women came and told them that Jesus wasn’t dead in the tomb. What a shock and yet joyful news. But what next?

The women were also told that Jesus was going on ahead of them to Galilee. So maybe they weren’t left without direction after all. So, the disciples make the trip to Galilee. I’m sure it was a long one as they wondered if the story of his resurrection were really true, and if they would really see Jesus.

The resurrection story that we celebrate on Easter Sunday is a story of surprise and confusion and then hope. Like the disciples who first heard the news we may have mixed emotions at Easter. We certainly love to hear the songs of praise that we sing on Easter Sunday, “*Christ the Lord is Risen Today.*” We like to feel the energy and share the springtime excitement with others. We like to hear again that we need not fear death, but we also may wonder, “What’s next after Easter Sunday?” “What’s next for my life now?”

In the account in Matthew we see that once the disciples get to Galilee says that they do see him and they worshipped him, and some still doubted. And the disciples get their final instructions.

“Go to the people of all nations and make them my disciples. Baptize them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to do everything I have told you. I will be with you always, even until the end of the world.” (Mt. 28:19-20 CEV) So, that’s what we are to do. That’s what’s next.

Like the disciples in that we often have mixed reactions to twisting turns of life. Sadness one minute, joy the next, and most of the time we just seem to bumble along not sure where to turn next. But as disciples of Jesus we are given instructions to help us move forward as Easter people, as followers of the risen Christ. We are given a mission. We are to help others hear the story and help them become disciples. Jesus says “make them my disciples” and “teach them everything I have told you.” That’s our “What next.”

As fellow followers who worship together and sometimes have our share of doubts about the future, may we be faithful in carrying out the Easter message of hope as the church. And may we always remember that Jesus promises to be with us “even to the end of the world.”

## A Little Church History

### PASTORAL LEADERSHIP AT MOSCOW UNITED METHODIST

Our church began officially in 1854 and has been served by many pastors and their families over the years. In the early years of our history a number of pastors served for fairly short periods of time: one to three years. From the beginning of the church in 1854 until 1931 there were 26 different pastors. Here are the names and dates of the pastors who were appointed to Moscow since the early 1930's.

Daniel H. Ling (1988-1991)  
Vaughn C. Glover, Jr. (1991-1997)  
Brolin C. Parker (1997-2000)  
Judith J. Seibold (2000-2002)  
Jon J. Buxton (2002-2011)

The two pastors who have served our congregation the longest since 1854 are **Marvin K. Schell** and **Jon J. Buxton**, both for nine (9) years.

# HomeTouch

Scripture Reading: Luke 24:13-35

**THOUGHT: One joy scatters a hundred griefs.** —Chinese proverb

We will call her Dorothy Granger.

If you were to meet Dorothy for the very first time, it would be immediately evident that Dorothy has some serious physical health issues. Although a fairly young woman, she has difficulty walking and has to depend on a cane to get around and sometimes friends and family need to help. Every step she takes, registers pain and sympathy from those who see her. But Dorothy's physical problems don't stop her. She never appears depressed or angry. A smile is always on her face.

Dorothy is a singer and she's often asked by local congregations and civic groups to come to their gatherings and perform. Those who gather to hear her notice right away that once she begins to sing, *she is transformed and becomes a new creature!* Expressions of joy, delight and exuberance register throughout her performance. She leaves her audiences speechless and caught up in the moment. The community considers her a gift.

She doesn't take any credit for what happens when she performs. She says that God's presence takes hold of her and gives her the power to do what she does. She considers her talent a blessing that is to be shared with others. Her songs of joy are not just for her audiences, but also for herself.

Can we all be like Dorothy? Like her, can we, too, be willing to look beyond our own aches and pains and shortcomings to share our gifts and blessings with others?

Each of us is a gift from God, endowed with God's spirit to help make the world a better place in some way or another. 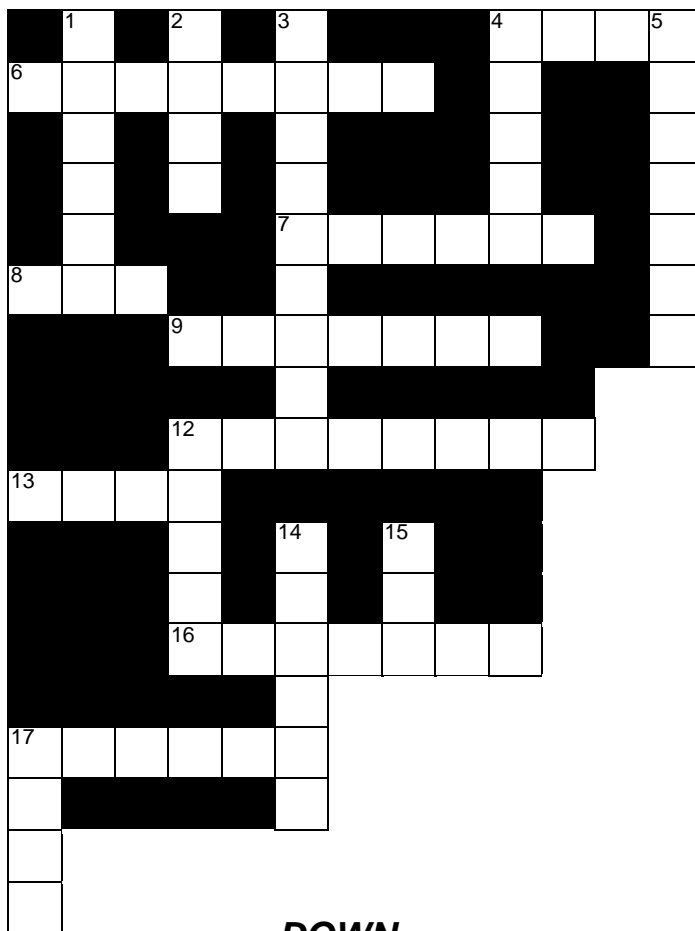
